Early in the morning on Wednesday the 19th day of December 2018, Karen Evelynanne Tucker Turner met her Savior Jesus Christ face to face. Karen was born on the 27th day of June 1957 to Sylvia Kay DeMent Tucker and Leonard Dennis “Dan” Tucker. Her parents precede her in death. In addition, Karen was an Associate Broker for Brik Realty working primarily for Jeff Richardson the past five years.

During her formative years, she and her family attended First Baptist Church of Center Point. Her pastor during those years was Ralph Feild. Pastor Feild’s favorite and oft quoted verse was Phillipian’s 1:21...”For me to live is Christ, and to die is gain”.
