August 28, 1947 - April 17, 2021

Thomas Joseph Daugherty , 73, of Mount Olive, Al, passed away on April 17, 2021. He graduated from the Alabama School of the Deaf (ASD) in Talladega in 1968. He worked for over 10 years in the valve shop at Stockham Valve and Fittings in Birmingham. An avid fan of University of Alabama football, Thomas was an athlete and a leader himself excelling in a number of sports. In 2010, he was inducted into ASD's Hall of Fame for his achievements on the basketball court. In the same year he was recognized by both the Southeast Athletic Association of the Deaf and the Dixie Deaf Bowling Association (where he served as board president for 12 years) for his leadership and outstanding accomplishment.

He is preceded in death by his grandparents and adoptive parents Joseph and L. Ruth Daugherty, birth mother Ruth Capps, and brother Joe Hammack. He is survived by his loving wife of 45 years, Martha (Musgrove) Daugherty, daughter Della Daugherty, son-in-law Russell Brunner, grandson Logan Brunner, and brother John Hammack.
