February 6, 1943 - February 7, 2021

Vincent Krasnisky, 78 of Mt. Olive passed away on February 7, 2021 from throat cancer. A native of Lithuania, he was orphaned in Germany in 1949 and was brought to the United States for adoption. Adopted by Joe and Tillie Krasnisky, he grew up in Walker Township, PA. A 1960 graduate of Tamaqua High School, a USAF Veteran, and a 28 year employee of Bendix Field Engineering Corp./Honeywell. He retired to Alabama in 1995.

Survivors include his loving wife of 52 years, Ripple; three stepsons, Edward Dick, Alan Dick and Barry Riley (Carol) and adopted daughter, Rhonda; Seven grandchildren; brother, Algird (Linda) and sister, Jean Pike.

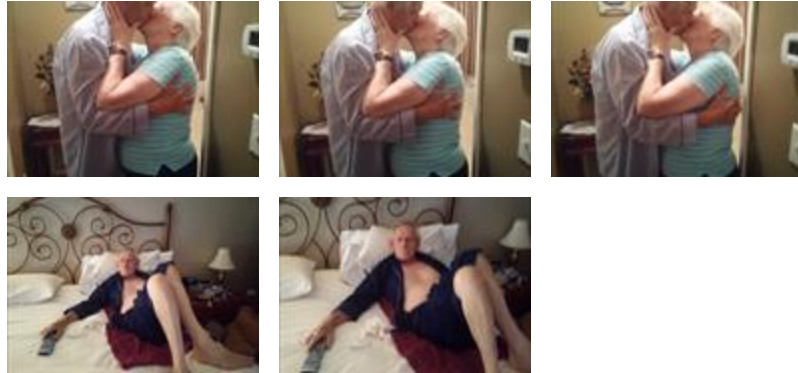

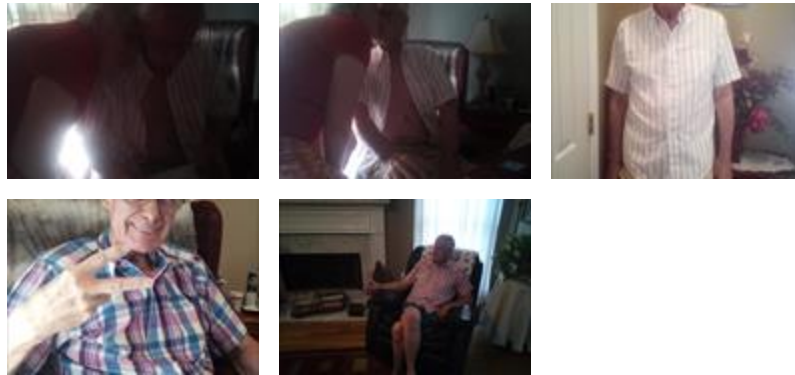
